

# Shuttle Motif

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## Abbreviations:

R=ring      CH=chain  
 "-="picot      "+="join  
 CLR=close ring R      W=reverse work

## Diagram Key:

○ =ring      — =picot  
 ◡ =chain      + =join

## Row #1

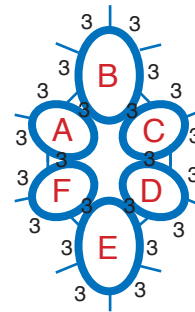
RA: 3-3-3-3, CLR  
 RB: 3+(to last p of RA)3-3-3-3, CLR  
 RC: 3+(to last p of RB)3-3-3, CLR  
 RD: 3+(to last p of RC)3-3-3, CLR  
 RE: 3+(to last p of RD)3-3-3-3, CLR  
 RF: 3+(to last p of RE)3-3+(to first p of RA)3, CLR  
 Tie and work in ends.  
 Another option is to load two shuttles and make RF a split ring to bridge up to the next row.

## Row #2

RA: 3+(to p of RF in Row#1)3, CLR, RW  
 CH: 3-3-3-3, RW  
 RB: 3+(to p of RA in Row#1)3, CLR, RW  
 CH: 3-3-3-3, RW  
 RC: 3+(to first free p of RB in Row#1)3, CLR, RW  
 CH: 3-3-3-3, RW  
 RD: 3+(to next p of RB in Row#1)3, CLR, RW  
 RE: 3+(to last p of prev CH)3-3-3-3, CLR, DO NOT RW  
 CH: 3-3-3-3, RW  
 RF: 3+(to next p of RB in Row#1)3, CLR, RW  
 CH: 3-3-3-3, RW  
 This completes one half of the motif. Continue on in the same order from RG to RL and the chain following.  
 Tie and work in ends.
